It seemed appropriate, then, to choose for our logo a 25mm diameter silver medal or jetton issued in 1588 by Ambrose Dudley, Third Earl of Warwick. It depicts a bear and ragged staff, the badge of the Earls of Warwick, with the legend *OMNIA TEMPUS HABENT*, *(ALL THINGS HAVE THEIR TIME)*.
